The Training in Contemporary Psychoanalytical Psychotherapy

TCCP Seminar - Saturday 29th September 2019

“The emergence and submergence of authenticity: exploring Winnicott's concepts of the False Self and Transitional Processes”

Speaker: Professor Adrian Sutton, Director of The Squiggle Foundation

Professor Adrian Sutton's presentation will describe and explore the concepts of “True and False Self” and “Transitional Processes” as part of Winnicott's formulations of his theory of Maturational Processes. Theoretical concepts will be illustrated with detailed clinical material to demonstrate the potential value of a form of playfulness and disciplined spontaneity in therapeutic processes. The morning will provide an opportunity for discussion and exploration of their significance in everyday life, professional practice and for the organisational structures within which practice occurs. The presentation will be of interest to trainees / practitioners in psychoanalytic psychotherapy, child development, mental health, education, and social welfare, teachers of psychodynamic theory and practice and those from other fields with an interest in psychoanalytic ideas and their application.

Biography: Adrian Sutton is Director of The Squiggle Foundation. He is Visiting Professor of Psychiatry at Gulu University, Uganda and Honorary Senior Teaching Fellow in Medical Education at Manchester University. He was previously Consultant in Child & Family Psychiatry and Psychotherapy at the Winnicott Centre, Royal Manchester Children's Hospitals. He is the author of *Psychiatry, Paediatrics and Psychoanalysis: through counter-transference to case management* (2013) and his other publications reflect his interest in applying psychoanalytic understanding in child and family health and welfare, medical education and professional ethics.
