UN Secretary General Guterres says that “the global climate target is on life support”. In facing the climate crisis, we can feel personally daunted, at a loss to see what part can be played by psychological professionals in general and Jungian psychotherapists in particular. In this presentation Judith will offer ways in which the imaginal and relational offer possibilities to strengthen relationships and resilience. Perhaps we can think together about what this can contribute to the situation.

Judith Anderson is a Jungian Analytical Psychotherapist with a background in psychiatry. Interested in the intersection of psychotherapy with societal issues for many years, she has been particularly focussed on the climate crisis for over 15 years. She is currently Chair of Climate Psychology Alliance, an organisation with an international reach which researches and publishes, develops methods of therapeutic support, provides CPD for psychological professionals, has a particular concern for Youth and offers talks and consultation for organisations and businesses.


Emerging from my experience of clinical work I began to realise that many theories of development were insufficient to describe the complexity of who we are. I became aware that number symbolism, Jung’s work on alchemy, the dynamics of the psyche/self and ideas about the quintessence (the essence of matter and being) provided a much richer perspective from which to consider the self and its potential.

This talk will consider, using clinical examples, how such ideas enable a deeper exploration and understanding of the self and how the concept of the quintessence provides a symbol from which to consider and examine the potential, known and unknown, within ourselves.

Dr. Christine Driver is a Fellow of the Foundation for Counselling and Psychotherapy (FPC) and a Training Analyst of the Society of Analytical Psychology (SAP). She was Director of Training and Clinical Services at WPF Therapy, and

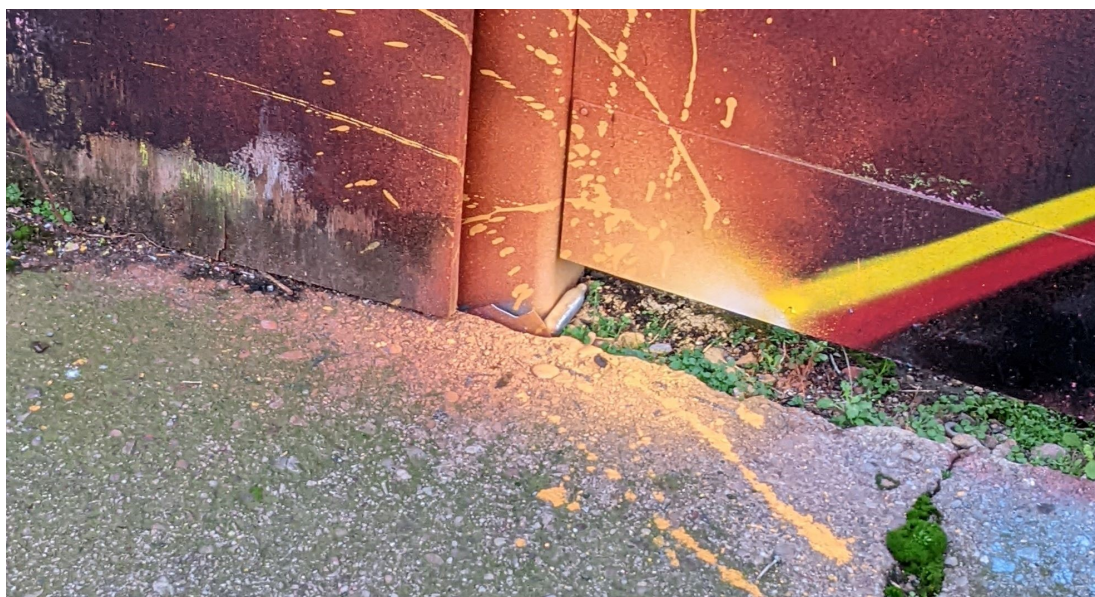
Inna writes: Einstein said: "Intuitive mind is a sacred gift! And the rational mind is a faithful servant!" Jung had the gift of intuition that often manifested in his life and work and that became the foundation for researching and describing the notion of 'synchronicity'. He viewed synchronicity as a creative principle constantly operating in nature that reveals one of the

archetypes and on the other hand to the situation of “impossibility” to find a solution or an explanation to one’s actions or premonitions. Already now, after nine months of war I can describe my observations of how the subconscious “anxious” image of disaster was penetrating the conscious level in the form of dreams, thoughts, premonitions and symbols and after a while the objective physical situation coincided with those images. Those were the phenomena, apocalyptic dreams, obsessive images and anxious premonitions of disaster/war that the year before the war was filled within Ukraine. There will be a presentation of clinical material: dreams, visions, premonitions of both Ukrainian and Russian clients
