The Father is a psychological drama film directed by Florian Zeller, in his directorial debut. He co-wrote the screenplay with fellow playwright Christopher Hampton and it is based on Zeller's 2012 play Le Père. The story follows an octogenarian Welsh man living with dementia.

He refuses assistance from his daughter and as the dementia distorts his perceptions he tries to make sense of his changing circumstances leading him to doubt his loved ones, his own mind and even the fabric of his reality.

Are your instructions for professional trustees current?

We all are required to have a system in place to make sure our patients are appropriately informed if we are suddenly unable to work due to illness, other circumstances or in the event of our death. It's not the most enticing thing to think about, but we need to do it. To work properly, it is more than a list of patients and contact information. We need to make sure that it will work in terms of next of kin knowing who to call, making sure that the trustees have access to all that they will need (e.g. mobile phone messages, emails, other records). These things may change, so we need to review them and check our arrangements regularly.

We are thinking of running a workshop for members to think about the robustness of their arrangements, and share ideas for good practice. Please email Jools by the end of July to let her know if you would be interested in attending a workshop on this.

WMIP & Flatpack Festival collaboration - Mediterranean Fever

A wonderful collaboration between the WMIP Analytic Film Group and Flatpack Film Festival brought over 70 people to the MAC in Birmingham on 21st May.

After a brief introduction to the connections between cinema and psychoanalysis by Andrea Sabbatini, whose reflections set us up nicely to watch the movie with a thoughtful eye, we settled in to watch Mediterranean Fever.

What a treat! Maha Haj's stunning (and strangely funny) film compellingly evokes the dynamics of depression and aggression, hopelessness and manipulation, played out through the tense relationship between Waleed, a chronically depressed writer (in therapy), and Jalal, the low-level crook who moves in next door. As their relationship develops, the unconscious balance of power shifts dramatically in ways that feel utterly accurate psychologically.

The well-paced narrative is set against the background of occupation, but apart from a couple of vivid scenes (a violent quarrel between Jamal and Waleed, and a conversation between Waleed and his son) the political is largely implicit, environmental, as omnipresent as the sea air or traffic noise, subtly infiltrating every act. The lens is focussed on the personal drama unfolding, but never as if in a vacuum. It reminded me of the way we might be acutely aware of the 'mood' of a patient's early environment in the consulting room, while staying focussed on the present moment.

The audience, most of whom were not psychotherapists, stayed on for a wide-ranging and lively discussion, expertly facilitated by WMIP's Laura Chaisty. Andrea Sabbatini's analysis was interesting, although his sympathies seemed to lie more with the depressed Waleed than mine did. We talked about depression, gender, and particularly about the meaning of the enigmatic opening scene, which, like a dream, I had actually forgotten about while caught up in the drama... There were many contributions from the floor and the debate could have gone on much longer than time allowed. (It did, in fact, among those of us who retired to the bar afterwards.)

This was a terrific event, very well presented, in an excellent venue at a highly accessible ticket price. I felt it was valuable CPD too, and look forward to future collaborations between the WMIP Analytic Film Group and Flatpack Festival.
